- Lisa Billy (Citizen of Chickasaw Nation)
  - The Honorable Lisa Billy is known for her tenacity and uncompromising loyalty to her Chickasaw Nation. During her time at the Oklahoma House of Representatives she founded the Indian Caucus that brought fellow Native Americans together in bi-partisan efforts for Native American affairs in Oklahoma. She rose through her party ranks to be Deputy Majority Whip. Until recently, she served as the Oklahoma Secretary of Native American Affairs, and throughout her career in Oklahoma politics, she has served numerous terms as a Legislator for the Chickasaw Nation.

      - Wedding gift from Mother-in-Law. Both the Billy (Choctaw) and Jackson (Chickasaw) families are synonymous with traditional living; from them have come artists and politicians.

- Janie Dillard (Citizen of Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma)
  - Janie Dillard is synonymous with drive, decisiveness, and uncompromising dedication to the advancement of Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, and also her shoes. Her career in the Gaming Industry started nearly 30 years ago in the Idabel Bingo Hall making popcorn, and upon taking the Senior Executive Officer position over Choctaw Nation Commerce she was the CEO of Choctaw Casinos. She is regarded as one of the best in the casino business. Consider this, in such a short time she went from making popcorn to a leader of the 4th largest gaming market in the world. To say Janie Dillard is to say Choctaw Economic Development.

- Reverend Dr. Cannon Carol Hampton (Citizen of Caddo Nation)
  - Cannon Hampton has tirelessly pushed for acknowledgement and reconciliation between Native Americans and the Episcopal Church. Her efforts have taken her internationally for the advancement of indigenous peoples and faith. As Caddo Matriarch she has imbued her roles of academic and clergy.

      - Cannon Hampton championed the acknowledgement of the troubled American past treatment of Native Americans by the Episcopal Church. As demonstration of this effort, the Saint Paul Cathedral (Oklahoma City) dedicated the Oakerhater Chapel in honor to a former Cheyenne warrior, Prisoner of War, and Deacon serving the Indian Territory and Oklahoma between 1881 and 1931. At the dedication, the Very Reverend George Black, stated "We write into our cathedral walls a new history. In doing so we raise up a new love story in the midst of many old stories of abuse and disrespect suffered by American Indians."
      - Based on original glasswork by Preston Singletary.
    - Episcopal interpretation of the Native American Medicine Wheel for the 4 Directions.
- Justice Yvonne Kauger (Citizen of Colony, Oklahoma)
  - To address contemporary Oklahoma and Indian Nations is not possible without including her. Her family's history with Indian Country, and the Cheyenne in particular, is a testament to what Oklahoma should be. Her grandmother passed away giving birth to her father, who two local Cheyenne women fed and nourished. He grew up as part of the Yellowman and Hart families, embracing a traditional honor-debt, which his descendants have maintained. It is from this genuine space that Justice Kauger has endeavored to champion Indian Country.

      - Justice Kauger was charged by Justice Doolin to establish an American Indian Law between the emerging Tribal Nations and the Oklahoma Judiciary.
      - It is the preeminent of its kind. Sovereignty Symposium has been a success for a few reasons: it is subject to the Judicial Canon, thereby ensuring its impartiality, it is a place for long-term dialogue, it is respectful, it allows for visionary discourse.
      - 34 years ago panels with a then Lt. Governor Bill Anoatubby asked if Indian Bingo was possible—10 years ago he built the largest casino in the world.

- After 35 years, 169 meetings, and 169 plates of her legendary cookies, Justice Kauger led the consolidation of the Oklahoma Judiciary into one center and separate from the Legislature and Executive Branches.

  - As a Nursing Lab Technician, she was able to attend the Oklahoma City University Law Night School.

- Sheila Morago (Member of Gila River Tribal Community)
  - Sheila Morago has been in the vanguard of Indian Gaming; starting with Gila River's first casino, the development of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, and the executive directorships of the Arizona and Oklahoma Indian Gaming Associations. She came to Oklahoma 8 years before the 2020 Oklahoma Gaming Compact Renewal. Why? Being a member of the Gila River Tribal Community she had no dog in the impending Oklahoma fight—so neutral. But 8 years meant that she would be accepted as one of us—so the 9th year she could be positioned to help push through the Compact Renewal, which it was.

      - When she arrived in Oklahoma City, I was asked to help her with introductions. Having met her only once before, I contrived to know whom I was 'stuck'...hehehe. The first event was a fundraiser and upon entry she saw this pair of stilettos: "Mine". I knew she was going to be fun.
    - State of Arizona Proposition 202—Victory
    - Pima Designs—Basketry & Man in the Maze
      - Gila River Tribal Community is part of the greater Pima people. They are known for their basketry and a necessary obsession with water, as they are a desert people; hence, the merging of the blue/water. They are also synonymous with the 'Man in the Maze' symbolizing the birth, life, death, and after-life of humans.
- Nuchi Nashoba (Citizen of Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma)
  - In 1989, the Minister of Defense of the Republic of France came to Oklahoma to bestow Knighthoods to the original five Code Talkers, each of whom were deceased citizens of the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma. As defined by their security oath, they had taken to their graves the secrets of their service. This was the first that their descendants knew of the extent of their contribution, and a decision was made to see their efforts acknowledged by the United States. An association of descendants was formed with Nuchi Nashoba leader. She lobbied Congress for years, and when legislation was drafted she insisted that it be kept open for other Native

American Tribes to join; so that they would not have to go through what we did. And it is for this particular point that I have selected Nuchi Nashoba: in so doing, she created what in effect was the first Inter-Tribal Warrior Society of Descendants.

- Tara Katuk Mac Lean Sweeney (Member of Native Village of Barrow Traditional Iñupiat Government and the Iñupiat Community of the Arctic Slope, and shareholder in the Arctic Slope Regional Corporation)
  - Tara Sweeney has spent her life like her mother: representing her village. Being the head of the Bureau of Indian Affairs is a difficult affair at any time, but coming from Alaska only adds to her task. Alaska Native Corporations and Indian Nations in the Lower 48 do not share much in common, be that legally, culturally, or structurally; and the distance remains a real barrier. Oklahoman Indian Nations, especially, do not know the cultural solidity that is the birthright of her people, whom have inhabited the same space for over 10,000 years. She is an excellent bridge-maker.

      - Upon appointment as the Assistant Secretary Indian Affairs for the U.S. Department of the Interior, an immediate call to action was addressing violence against Native American women. Because of on/off reservation multi-jurisdictional problems, the solution was is the largest multi-agency law enforcement initiative in Indian Affairs history.
    - Arctic Slope Regional Corporation
      - Alaska Native Americans have a very different experience with the United States than those of us in Oklahoma. In the case of Tara Sweeney, her village was not removed and so has been in place for more than 10,000 years. Their federal recognition is very different too, and structured as Alaska Native Corporations with members as shareholders. She worked for her Arctic Slope Regional Corporation and is known for mentoring.

      - Near her village of Utqiagvik, Alaska is ancient remains of earthen homes and community made visible by sea and land with arches of enormous whale bones.
